

ORDINANCE NO. 09-39 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT WITH R.P. HUGHES ARCHITECTS, INC., OF COLUMBUS, OHIO, FOR PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES FOR THE OBERLIN FIRE STATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 09-01 AC CMS the contract between the City of Oberlin and R.P. Hughes Architects, Inc. was amended to authorize additional services for additional necessary work related to the Oberlin Fire Station Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to authorize an additional amendment to said contract to provide for the cost of additional work necessary for the construction management of said project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the contract with R.P. Hughes Architects, Inc. of Columbus, Ohio, for the furnishing of Professional Design Services for the City of Oberlin Fire Station Improvement Project, as authorized by Ordinance 08-34 AC CMS, as amended, is hereby amended to authorize additional services as reflected in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and in an amount not to exceed \$85,000.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, or to provide for the usual daily operations of a municipal department, to wit:


"to authorize additional architectural/construction administration compensation based upon contract provisions as soon as possible in order to avoid construction delays",

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

AIA DOCUMENT G606-2000*Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement***GENERAL INFORMATION**

PURPOSE AND RELATED DOCUMENTS. AIA Document G606 is intended to be used by the Architect when amending the professional services provisions in most of the AIA's Owner-Architect agreements, such as B141, Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Architect with Standard Form of Architect's Services, and B151, Abbreviated Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Architect.

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COMPLETING THE G606 DOCUMENT

This document should be submitted to the Owner's Representative. The "Agreement dated" should be the date of the original Agreement between the parties.

The G606 document is appropriate for use by two parties who have an agreement for professional services. The names of the parties should be indicated as they appear on the original Agreement. Similarly, the Project's name and address should be described as they appear in the original Agreement.

Proposed Contingent Additional Services or a Change in Services should be described fully.

Complete provisions for compensation and time should be listed.

Finally, the G606 document should be signed in a manner consistent with that of the original Agreement.
