ORDINANCE No. 11-17 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH OBERLIN COMMUNITY SERVICES COUNCIL AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Oberlin Community Services Council is a non-profit organization that brings important services to economically disadvantaged persons, children, and the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oberlin desires to provide funding to said organization in order that those important services are provided to the residents of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager be, and hereby is, authorized to enter into a contract with Oberlin Community Services Council, whereby the City will provide financial assistance to Oberlin Community Services Council in an amount not to exceed \$30,000, as appropriated in Ordinance No. 10-86 AC CMS, said monies to be used for operating purposes to provide to the residents of Oberlin emergency assistance services and youth tutoring services as set forth in the agreement attached hereto as **“Exhibit A”** and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit:

“to timely provide funds for important contracted services”,

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement made and concluded at Oberlin, Ohio, this 30th day of March, 2011, by and between the City of Oberlin, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as CITY), and the Oberlin Community Services Council (hereinafter referred to OCSC).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the OCSC is a non-profit organization which provides emergency assistance to low-income persons and a general information and referral program and a youth tutoring program which benefits numerous Oberlin residents; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has, through Ordinance No. 10-86 AC CMS deemed is necessary to appropriate the sum of THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$30,000.00) for emergency assistance and a general information and referral program and a youth tutoring program for the residents of the CITY; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the CITY has, through Ordinance No. 11-17 AC CMS deemed it necessary to authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with OCSC whereby OCSC will provide such services to the CITY; and,

WHEREAS, the CITY in return for the services to be rendered by OCSC will provide financial and support assistance to the OCSC.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and other valuable consideration, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

SECTION 1. That for the Fiscal Year 2011, the OCSC will operate an emergency assistance, general information and referral program, and a youth

tutoring program in the City of Oberlin, Ohio, and provide those services to the residents of the CITY.

SECTION 2. The CITY will provide OCSC with the sum of THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$30,000.00) towards the cost of operating said program within the CITY payable in two annual installments.

SECTION 3. Upon request, the OCSC will provide the CITY with periodic reports and will allow the CITY to review its financial records, in order to assure the CITY that the services contemplated are, in fact, being satisfactorily and efficiently provided.

SECTION 4. The OCSC shall carry public liability insurance in an amount and form as approved by the CITY, and agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the CITY from any and all losses, claims, damages, and judgments arising out of or resulting from the operation of said services.


