### ORDINANCE No. 12-30 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FORMULA ALLOCATION PROGRAM FUNDING FROM THE LORAIN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF INSTALLING AUDIBLE ALERTS AT A SIGNALIZED INTERSECTION IN THE DOWNTOWN AREA AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Oberlin is eligible to receive FY 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the State of Ohio's Small Cities Formula Allocation Program; and

WHEREAS, the Lorain County Community Development Department has advised that funding is potentially available under the FY 2012 CDBG Formula Allocation Program; and

WHEREAS, said CDBG program funds must be used for an eligible purpose including improving accessibility; and

WHEREAS, the installation of audible alerts at a signalized intersection would assist visually impaired persons to cross streets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain and State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to apply for FY 2012 CDBG Formula Allocation Program Funds to the Lorain County Board of Commissioners for grant funding assistance for the proposed installation of audible alerts at a signalized intersection, and further authorized to accept any such grant award.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit:

"in order to allow for the timely application for said grant funding in accordance with all applicable procedures, including the submission deadline of April 30, 2012"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.

- 8. If improvements are being mandated to meet state or local requirements, letter(s) from agency(s) requiring improvements **must** be attached.

Changes in intersection design and signalization as well as the presence of quiet cars have affected the traditional street crossing techniques used by the blind ovisually-impaired pedestrians. If awarded grant funding, the City will consider two types of APs systems for the Main and College intersection as described in the attached memorandum. Expected project outcomes include enhanced safety and communication to the visually-impaired and blind citizens and visitors at the City's busiest intersection.
