## ORDINANCE No. 15-27 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF OBERLIN AND THE OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION (PATROL OFFICERS, SERGEANTS, AND FULL-TIME DISPATCHERS) RELATED TO THE SICK LEAVE DONATION POLICY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the attached amendment to the Collective Bargaining Agreements between the City of Oberlin, Ohio, and the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (OPBA) for the Patrol Officers, Sergeants, and Full-Time Dispatchers is hereby approved for each agreement, and the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute same on behalf of the City.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit: to authorize participation in the sick leave donation program by OPBA members as soon as possible to ensure the orderly and efficient operation of the municipality, and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
