ORDINANCE No. 15-57 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING HOW PROCEEDS OF ALCOHOL SALES AT CITY OF OBERLIN FUNDRAISERS WILL BE DEPOSITED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, not less than five-sevenths (5/7) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: When alcoholic beverages are purchased for resale at City of Oberlin-sponsored fundraising events, all proceeds from such resale, after any event-related expenses have been paid, shall be deposited into an account established by the Finance Director for the purpose of holding and tracking the funds raised and shall be utilized solely for the purposes for which the fundraising event was held.

SECTION 2: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit: to provide for the timely purchase of beer to be sold at a special event to promote the Oberlin Underground Railroad Center project” and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
