RESOLUTION No. R18-02 CMS

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING HEATHER ADELMAN AS THE DESIGNEE OF THE MEMBERS OF COUNCIL FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS LAW AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Ohio Law requires elected officials to undergo educational training for every term of office related to the requirements of the public records law, Ohio Revised Code Section 149.43; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 109.43 provides that the elected officials of a public office may appoint a Designee to undergo such training on their behalf; and

WHEREAS, Council has determined that Heather Adelman, Council member of Oberlin City Council should serve as the legal designee of the members of Council.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:


SECTION 1. That Heather Adelman is hereby appointed the “Designee” within the meaning set forth in Ohio Revised Code Section 109.43

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit: to allow designation to be in place prior to the State Auditors training date” and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
