ORDINANCE No. 22-35 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 351.17 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN TO DELEGATE AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH PARKING REGULATIONS IN THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT TO THE CITY MANAGER AND TO ESTABLISH ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

WHEREAS, to facilitate commerce and good order within the Central Business District, Council desires to vest the City Manager with certain authority and discretion to make and amend parking regulations within said District and to provide for administrative penalties for violations of those regulations.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Section 351.17 of the Oberlin Codified Ordinances be and is hereby amended to read as is set forth on **Exhibit A.**

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall take effect on the earliest date allowed by law.

EXHIBIT A

351.17 PARKING IN THE CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT

- (a) The City Manager is authorized and directed to ascertain upon what portions of the public streets in the Central Business District require restrictions and limitations as to time or the prohibition of the parking of motor vehicles as he or she shall deem to be appropriate and conducive to good commerce within said District. The City Manager is further authorized to erect and maintain appropriate signs indicating such times and prohibitions. It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in violation of a sign so erected.
- (b) No person shall park a bicycle in a public bicycle rack on the public streets in the Central Business District of the City for a period longer than twenty-four hours.
- (c) Public streets in the Central Business District are defined as Main Street (between Vine Street and the crosswalk between Tappan Square and Hall Auditorium) and College Street (between Professor Street and Pleasant Street).
- (d) The Police Department shall make regular patrols of the defined area and shall issue citations for any violation of this section.
- (e) The owner of the motor vehicle or bicycle which is parked in the defined area in violation of this section shall be responsible for such violation and the violation citation shall be issued to such owner.
