



## Additional Recycling Drop-off Options:



- Paper Retriever bin program recycling office paper, magazines, newspapers, paperback books, catalogs, school papers, junk mail, phone books, shredded paper in clear plastic or brown paper bags and emptied & flattened cardboard in the green & yellow bins throughout Oberlin.
- CFL & LED bulbs do contain a small amount of mercury and that's why they should never be thrown away in your regular garbage. Both CFLs & LEDs can be dropped off at City Hall, 85 S. Main St., Monday-Friday, 8am-4:30pm.
- Recycle used tooth brushes, empty toothpaste tubes, empty floss containers and their packaging through Oberlin College's <u>Oral Care Brigade</u> program. Drop these items off at City Hall, Monday-Friday, 8am-4:30pm.
- Drop-off metal lids at City Hall, M F, 8am-4:30pm (from food jars) like pickles, spaghetti & fruit jars.
- PakTech Ring Carriers Drop-off beverage ring carriers in the marked container, M-F, 8:00am-4:30pm.
- Plastic bags & film packaging wraps Walmart, Kohl's and
   Giant Eagle stores accept plastic grocery bags. Giant Eagle
   also accepts newspaper bags, dry cleaning bags, bread &
   produce bags; snacks & beverage case wrap, paper towel, bathroom tissue and diaper wraps. Bags &





- Drop your old Eyeglasses, (readers, sunglasses and kids glasses) in the Lions, Recycle for Sight

   Collection Box located in the office at 309 W. Lorain, Cleveland Clinic Cole Eye West. They accept both prescription and non-prescription eyewear and sunglasses too, in both adults' and children's sizes.
- Residential Composting Program The City of Oberlin has partnered with Barnes Nursery to offer Oberlin residents a food waste composting program. Sign-up on the City's website.
- Vinyl Siding Recycling Vinyl siding and its associated trim pieces can be dropped off at 16909 State
  Route 58 Oberlin. Behind the center building there are containers ready to receive these items. Open
  7am 7pm, M-F.
- Styrofoam No Styrofoam is recyclable period! Place all Styrofoam molded pieces, peanuts, egg cartons, etc. in your trash cart.
