RESOLUTION No. R24-03 CMS

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING CITY OFFICIAL(S) WHO CAN ESTABLISH ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS FROM LORAIN COUNTY FOR VARIOUS PROPERTY TAX SETTLEMENT PAYMENTS AND OTHER PAYMENTS TO THE CITY OF OBERLIN AS AN EMERGENCY MEASURE

WHEREAS, the Lorain County Auditor and Treasurer are now offering electronic payments to Lorain County subdivisions for payments of property tax settlements and other payments in place of paper checks mailed through the US Postal Service; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oberlin would like to receive various payments from Lorain County by ACH/electronic payment; and

WHEREAS, the Lorain County Auditor and Treasurer are requesting legislative authority designating the individual(s) who can establish electronic payments on behalf of the City of Oberlin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Ohio:

Section 1. The City Finance Director, I. Sal Talarico and City Treasurer, Robert Hillard are authorized to establish ACH/electronic payments instructions with the City's banking information for the Lorain County Auditor and Treasurer so the City of Oberlin may receive property tax settlement payments and other payments electronically from Lorain County.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio or to provide for the usual daily operation of a municipal department, to wit: to ensure property tax payments and other payments are received timely from Lorain County and provided that it is elevated to emergency status by the affirmative vote of at least five members of Council and receives the affirmative vote of at least five members of Council upon final passage, it shall go into full force and effect from and immediately after its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.
