AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 24-16 AC CMS TO APPOINT JESSICA MINOR-BAETENS AND REBECCA BANDY TO FILL VACANCIES ON THE CLIMATE ACTION PLAN UPDATE STEERING COMMITTEE TO GO INTO IMMEDIATE EFFECT

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 24-16 AC CMS, this Council ratified the appointment of the members of the Climate Action Plan Update Steering Committee and

WHEREAS, two of the members of the Climate Action Plan Update Steering Committee have resigned, and it is necessary to fill the resulting vacancies

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Exhibit A to Ordinance No. 24-26 AC CMS be and is hereby amended as is attached hereto as Exhibit A

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. To facilitate the development of an updated Climate Action Plan for the City of Oberlin as soon as possible and provided that at least five (5) members of Council determine by motion that this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect immediately after its passage; otherwise, it shall take effect on the earliest date allowed by law.
