Firefighters' Dependents Fund Board	2	Makes rules and regulations for the handling and processing of claims which may be submitted to it due to a volunteer firefighter's death or becoming totally and permanently disabled while discharging his/her duty. The board shall perform all such other duties as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of Ohio Revised Code Chapter 146.	Meets on an as-needed basis
